SAINT VALENTINE

Priest and Martyr. Patron of Greetings.



In the time of Emperor Claudius II, known also as Claudius the Cruel, St. Valentine and St. Marius, were dedicated Christ and refused to worship the twelve gods Claudius ordered them to worship. They assisted the martyrs of Rome who suffered during the reign of Emperor. Christianity was punishable by death. St. Valentine was apprehended, arrested and imprisoned for his faith. Legend tells us that during his last weeks, a jailer asked St. Valentine to teach his daughter Julia. Julia was blind from birth. St. Valentine taught her how to pray and Julia believed and asked God to heal her blindness. As they prayed together for her healing a bright light shone into the jail and Julia was healed. On the evening of his death, St. Valentine wrote one more note to Julia telling her to stay close to God and signed it "From your Valentine". (Hence the custom of messages of affection and love was born.) The next day, February 14, in the year 270, St. Valentine was sent to the Prefect of Rome, who commanded that he be beaten with clubs and afterward beheaded. St. Valentine loved God and his fellow martyrs to the end.

God of power and mercy, through Your help St. Valentine has overcome the tortures of his passion. Help us who celebrate his triumph to remain victorious over the wiles of our enemies. Amen.

CYRIL AND METHIDIUS

Patrons of the unity of the Eastern and Western Churches\

Methodius born in 826 and his brother Cyril who’s name was Constantine, until just before his death, was born 827. The brothers grew up as sons of a prominent Christian family in Thessalonica and were educated in Constantinople.. It is assumed Constantine and Methodius were familiar with the Slavic language. Methodius became an important civil official, but grew tired of worldly affairs and retired to a monastery. Constantine became a scholar and a professor known as "the Philosopher" in Constantinople. In 860 Constantine and Methodius went as missionaries to what is today the Ukraine. They were able administrators, and had already proven themselves successful missionaries. In Rome they brothers gave an account of their missionary work and were consecrated Bishops by Pope Hadrian II. Cyril died in Rome in 869 leaving Methodius to continue his missionary work which he did with success in Moravia, Bohemia and Poland. He died in Moravia in 883

February 16th

SAINT JULIANA

Virgin, Martyr



St. Juliana, a native of Cumae in Campania, Italy, was born in the third century into a house in which her father worshiped statues of Roman gods. Juliana herself knew believed in the one true God and in Jesus in whom she believed with all her heart and soul and committed her life to Him. She, true to the teachings of Jesus, shared her wealth with fellow Christians. When Juliana turned 18

her father gave her to Eleusius, Prefect of Cumae, to be married. She had no objection to this union in the believe she could convert her fiancée to the Christian Faith. She confided in him that she herself is a Christian, but her betrothed betrayed her and told her father. Her father tried to persuade to leave her Faith and worship his gods. When she refused her father handed her over to be beaten with rods and burned with boiling lead. Then he had her shackled, chained and thrown into a dungeon. There, at midnight, an angel appeared to her telling her to worship the Roman gods. When she prayed to her God, He showed her the true nature of the "angel" and told her to fight him. Miraculous her chains broke and Satan was chained. In the morning she showed the winged devil to the guards telling them that this is what their gods are like. (Today St. Juliana is pictured with a winged devil, which she leads on a chain.) That very day she was condemned to death. She was beheaded and so earned he crown of Martyrdom. It was the year 304, the year after Emperor Diocletian ordered the persecution of all Christians. Her remains were revered in her hometown till they were taken to Naples in the year 1207.



February 17th
**SEVEN FOUNDERS OF THE ORDER
OF SERVITES**

In 1233, on the feast of the Assumption seven members of a fraternity in Florence, Italy, devoted to the Holy Mother of God. As they gathered in prayer, the Blessed Virgin appeared to the young men, exhorting them to devote themselves to her service.

Once prominent businessmen of Florence retired to Monte Senario. With the approval of their Bishop these zealous Christians founded a new Order venerating the Seven Sorrows of Our Lady, hence they are called "Servants of Mary" or "Servites" Although the 'Servants of Mary' had the approval of their Bishop, they had not been recognized by the Holy See, it was only in 1259 that the Order was practically recognized by Alexander IV but not until 1304, that it received the explicit and formal approbation of Pope Benedict XI. All seven were beatified by Pope Clement XI on December 1st, 1717 and Canonized in 1887 by Pope Leo XII

Lord, infuse in us the piety of these blessed brothers by which they devoutly venerated the Mother of God and led Your people toward You. Amen.

THE LITURGICAL YEAR

At this time we are, for a few weeks in "Ordinary Time", which is called "ordinary" not because it is common or unimportant, but simply because the weeks of Ordinary Time are numbered. Ordinary Time refers to those periods that fall outside of the major liturgical seasons. The liturgical year in the Catholic Church starts with Advent, followed immediately by the season of Christmas. After Christmas we are for a short time in Ordinary Time, which begins on the Monday after the first Sunday after January 6th.and ends with Ash Wednesday, when the seasons of Lent and Easter follow. Ordinary Time starts again after Pentecost and continues until the final Sunday in Ordinary Time, the feast of Christ the King and Advent begins again...

The Seasons of Christmas and Easter we celebrate joyfully, while Advent and Lent are times of penance, watchfulness and expectation. During Advent we prepare for the Birth of our Saviour and during Lent His Resurrection.

During Ordinary Time the liturgical color of that we find on priestly vestments is green, the color of life and hope. White vestments are worn on days when we honor our Holy Mother Mary and Saints,

In Ordinary Time, the longest time in the liturgical year we consider the fullness of Jesus' teachings and miracles while on this earth. We hear about Christ's great love for us, His forgiveness extended to sinners, His teaching with authority, which means teaching by example. We hear Him inviting us to follow Him and to act like Him. Hearing how Jesus lived His life we realize, we know, that Christ is King. Therefore at the end of the ordinary time, which is also the end of the liturgical year, we celebrate this knowledge, by celebrating the Feast of Christ the King.
