ST. ISIDORE OF SEVILLE

Bishop and Doctor of the Church



St. Isidore was born in Cartagena, Spain about the year 560 into a noble family, literally a family of Saint. Two of his brothers, St. Leander, Archbishop of Seville and St.

Fulgentius, Bishop of Ecija and a sister St. Florentina, abbess, are numbered among the Saints. Isidore consecrated himself to the service of the Church and so prepared himself for his sacred ministry by virtue and learning. He was versed in the Latin, Greek and Hebrew languages. St. Isidore's education was looked after his much older brother St. Leander, whom he assisted in the conversion of the Visigoths from the Arian heresy. After his brother's death, St. Isidore became Archbishop of Seville. As archbishop he presided over many councils, was a voluminous write, compiled an encyclopaedia and dictionary. He became known as the greatest teacher in Spain. He governed his church for 37 years. He died in 636. In 1722 he was declared a doctor of the Church.

Lord, hear our prayers, which we offer o the commemoration of St. Isidore. May Your Church be instructed by his teaching. Amen

ST. VINCENT FERRER

Patron of Builders



St. Vincent Ferrer was born in Valencia , Spain in 1350. Vincent was not only remarkable for goodness, and piety, but also excelled in his studies. At the age of 18 Vincent entered the Order of Dominic, with the blessings of his parents. He received the religious habit February 5, 1374 and was professed the following year. Only 24 years of age he wrote a book on philosophy, and at 28 received the degree of Doctor in Theology. During the 14th century two terrible scourges inflicted most serious evil on the Church. First the Black Death, which devastated the whole of Europe. Many clergy and religious died from this awful pestilence. Because of the lack of clergy, men were accepted, men without a true vocation to fill the void. Laxities and irregularities were the natural consequence.

The second evil was more serious – the Great Schism. The evils arising from this scandal were many and grievous. St. Vincent Ferrer was one of those raised up by God's good Providence to bring the schism to an end and remedy its effects. His labours to promote unity affected his health. He fell gravely ill and eagerly welcomed death as his humble cell suddenly was filled with heavenly light and he saw Jesus Christ shining like the sun, surrounded by a multitude of angels and His two glorious servants St. Dominic and St. Francis. After filling his soul with joy he was told that he was chosen to be the herald of the Gospel. He was warned the wicked men will oppose him, but not to fear because He will be with him.

St. Vincent's apostolate lasted for 22 years. He preached throughout Europe where as a result tens of thousands were converted: Jews, Mohammedans, infidels and heretics alike. Even speaking in his native Spanish, he was understood in all tongues. Miracles confirmed his words. In many cities in Spain, synagogues were changed into churches.

St. Vincent died on April 5, 1419. He was canonized by Pope Callistus III on the Feast of Sts. Peter and Paul, June 29, 1455.

God, You raised up St. Vincent Your Priest for a ministry of evangelical preaching. Grant that we may see him reigning in heaven who while on earth proclaimed the future judgement. Amen.



April 7th

JOHN BAPTIST DE LA SALLE
Patron of Teachers

John Baptist de la Salle was born at Rheims, France on April 30th, 1651 into a noble family. He was the eldest of ten children. John studied in Paris and was ordained in 1678. John was very involved in education and founded the Institute of the Brothers of the Christian Schools (approved in 1725) and established teacher colleges (Rheims in 1687, Paris in 1699, and Saint Denis in 1709). John Baptist de la Salle was known for his work with the poor. He was one of the first to emphasize classroom teaching over individual instruction. He also began teaching in the mother tongue instead of in Latin. His schools were formed all over Italy. In 1705, he established a reform school for boys at Dijon. John was named patron of teachers by Pope Pius XII in 1950. He died at St. Yon, Rouen, on April 7th and was canonized by Pope Leo XIII in 1900.

God our Father, you chose John Baptist de la Salle as an educator of Christian youth. Give your Church good teachers today, who will dedicate themselves to instructing young people in human and Christian disciplines. Amen
