SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER

Like the apostle Thomas, from time to time we all doubt. We should not hide our questions. We must do what Thomas did — bring those doubts to the Lord. And our risen Lord will say to us what he said to Thomas; "Cease doubting and believe."

LET US REJOICE AND BE GLAD!

Today we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. Pope John Paul II established this Feast in the Jubilee Year 2000.

Jesus instructed Sister Faustina, when he appeared to her, to write down and to make A Novena to The Divine Mercy; beginning on Good Friday and ending on Feast of Divine Mercy.

Our Lord's words as recorded by Sister Faustina:

"I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fount of My mercy, that they may draw their strength and refreshment and whatever graces they have need of in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death.

On each day you will bring to My Heart a different group of souls and you will immerse them in this ocean of My mercy, and I will bring all these souls into the house of My Father. On each day you will beg My Father, on the strength of My bitter Passion, for graces for these souls". On the first day: All mankind, especially sinners. On the second day: The souls of Priests and Religious. On the third day: All devout and faithful souls. On the fourth day: Those who do not believe in me and those who do not yet know me. On the fifth day: The souls of the separated brethren. On the sixth day: The meek and humble and the souls of little children. On the seventh day: The souls who especially venerate and glorify My mercy. On the eight day: The souls who are detained in Purgatory. On the ninth day: Souls who have become lukewarm.

April 25th

SAINT MARK

Evangelist, Patron of Notaries, Egypt and Venice.



St. Mark, sometimes called John Mark, was a Jew by birth. He converted to Christianity after the Resurrection of Christ. He traveled with Sts. Paul and Barnabas on their first missionary journey. After the journey he went to Rome and acted as St. Peter's interpreter. It is believed, that he is the same Mark, that St. Peter called his son and that St. Mark wrote all that he has learned from St. Peter.

St. Mark is the author of the second Gospel, which is probably the oldest of the Gospels. Tradition says it was written in Rome, requested by Romans to set down the teachings of St. Peter, the apostle. Therefore Mark's Gospel is a record of the life of Jesus as seen through the eyes of the Prince of the Apostles.

St. Peter sent St. Mark into Egypt and appointed him Bishop of Alexandria where he founded the great church of Alexandria and preached the Gospel for 30 years, and increased the number of Christians. But heathens, called St. Mark a magician, on account of his many miracles. On April 24th, 68 A.D., St. Mark was, as he was offering up the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, seized; they tied his feet with cords and dragged him all day about the streets. The ground was stained with blood and strewn pieces of his flesh. At night they cast him into prison, where as legend has it, God comforted him with two visions. The following day, April 25th, they repeated the torture until St. Mark expired. Christians gathered up St. Mark's mangled body and buried it. In the 9th century it was translated to Venice, Italy. There the Saint is

represented in art with a lion at his feet and a scroll in his hand in which the words "Peace be to thee, o Mark, My Evangelist" are inscribed.

God our Father, You gave Saint Mark the Evangelist the privilege of proclaiming the Good News of Jesus Christ, Your son. Help us to know You well so that we may faithfully live our lives as followers of Christ. Our Saviour. Amen.

April 29th

SAINT CATHERINE OF SIENA Doctor of the Church, Co-Patroness of Europe

St. Catherine was born in 1347 in Siena, a town not far from Florence, Italy, She and a twin sister, who died in infancy, were the youngest of 25 children of Giacoma and Lapa

Benincase. Her father, a dyer, was well known for his piety. At a very young age Catherine gave already signs of future holiness. As 5 year old she loved the "Hail Mary" so greatly, that she would kneel and recite the prayer on each step going up and down the stairs. In her 6th year she was favored by the Lord with a vision, as she was on the way home after visiting her oldest, married sister and her brother Stephen. She saw above the Cathedral of St. Benedict a thrown on which our Divine Saviour, glad in pontifical robes, wearing a Tiara sat. With Him were St. Peter, St. Paul and St. John the Evangelist. As she looked at her beloved Redeemer in adoration, He made the sign of the Cross over her and smiled lovingly at her. From that moment on she was no longer a child. She wanted to only love God; penance, prayers and practices of virtue became her only desire. At 7 she made a vow of virginity. Even so her mother wanted for Catherine to marry, she remained true her beloved to Jesus as her heart belonged only to Him. When 16 years old she received the habit of the Third Order of St. Dominic. At 21 Catherine had a vision in which Jesus, her spiritual spouse took her heart from her breast. As Christ reappeared with a luminous heart, she heard these words:" My daughter, I have your heart and give you mine, that you might forever live in Me."

Catherine's life of prayer and penance was crowned by God with the gift of the Stigmata. The gift of prophecy and insight into the state of souls was bestowed upon her. St. Catherine cared for the poor and the sick. She counseled princes and popes. She was a peacemaker and is especially remembered for her spiritual reflections. Only 33 years old Catherine died in Rome on

April 30, 1380 and was canonized in 1461. Her body rests in the Minerva Church in Rome. Her "Dialogue" and other writings are a treasure house of mystic counsel.




