August 9th ST. TERESA BENEDICTA OF THE CROSS (St. Edith Stein)

Edith Stein was born into a large Orthodox Jewish family in Breslau, Germany (now Poland) on October 12, 1891. Edith became a convinced atheist

in her school and early university years, but never ceasing to seek truth. After reading, in one sitting, the autobiography of St. Teresa of Avila, she declaimed:

". This is the truth" and decided to become a Christian. Drown to Catholicism by the example of others she decided to be baptized into the Catholic Church January 1st, 1922. Edith Stein spent 12 years teaching at catholic institutions. In 1934 she joined the Carmelites in Cologne made her final vows 1937 and took the name Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. In 1938, because of Nazi anti-Semitism, which was widespread all throughout Germany, her prioress helped her escape to Holland. This was not a happy move. The Dutch nuns had less respect for her intellect as her German Sisters. On August 2nd, 1942, Sister Teresa Benedicta and her sister Rosa Stein were arrested by the Gestapo and transported to Auschwitz August 7th. She was briefly spotted walking through the camp among the women comforting and helping them. St. Benedicta, although a convert to Catholicism, she never denied her Jewish heritage and accepted her fate as her Cross. She died in the gas chamber August 8th, 1942. She was canonized October 11th, 1998.

A prayer by St. Edith Stein: "O my God, fill my soul with holy joy, courage and strength to serve You. Enkindle Your love in me and then walk with me along the next stretch of road before me. I do not see very far ahead, but when I have arrived where the horizon now closes down, a new prospect will open before me, and I shall meet it with peace. Amen

SAINT LAWRENCE

Patron of the poor and of Rome

In 257, when St. Sixtus became Pope, he ordained St. Lawrence deacon and appointed him first of the seven deacons who served in the Church of Rome. In the same year Emperor Valerian ordered that all Bishops, priests and



deacons be put to death. As St. Sixtus was lead to his execution, St. Lawrence followed him. At that time he was ordered by St. Sixtus to distribute the treasures of the church among the poor. St. Lawrence did as he was commanded. And so the Church of Rome looked after fifteen hundred poor people. In 258 the Prefect of Rome ordered St. Lawrence to surrender the treasures of the Church. Three days later he exhibited the poor whom he had gathered. The enraged Prefect ordered for St. Lawrence to be slowly roasted on a gridiron. This order was merciful executed with his last breath this holy deacon prayed for the conversion of Rome. Several heathen senators, who witnessed the execution, were converted to Christianity and gave St. Lawrence a decent burial.

Father, You called Saint Lawrence to serve You by love and crowned his life with glorious martyrdom. Help us to be like him in loving You and doing Your work. Amen.

ST. CLARE OF ASSISI Patroness of eye disease and goldsmiths

St. Clare of Assisi was born in Assisi on July 16, 1194, as Chiara Offreduccio, the eldest daughter of

wealthy parents. Her mother was a very devout woman. As a voung girl. Clare dedicated herself to praver. When she was 18 years old, she heard St. Francis of Assisi preach and asked him to help her live according to the Gospel. On Palm Sunday in 1212, Clare left her father's home to meet with St. Francis. Clare's hair was cut off and she was given a plain robe and veil. Clare joined the convent of the Benedictine nuns of San Paulo, under St. Francis' orders. When her father found her and attempted to force her back into his home, she refused and professed that she would have no other husband than Jesus Christ. In order to give her the greater solitude she desired, Francis sent Clare to another Benedictine nun's monaster, Sant' Angelo. Clare's sister Catarina, who took the name Agnes, joined her at this monastery. The two remained there until a separate dwelling was built for them next to the church of San Damiano. Over time, other women joined them to also be brides of Jesus and live with no money. They became known as the "Poor Ladies of San Damiano." They all lived a simple life of austerity, seclusion from the world, and poverty, according to a Rule which ST. Francis gave them as a Second Order. St. Clare and her sisters wore no shoes, ate no meat, lived in a poor house, and kept silent most of the time. Their lives consisted of manual labor and prayer. San Damiano became the center of Clare's new order. For a brief period of time, the order was directed by St. Francis himself and by 1216, Clare became the abbess of San Damiano Clare was so devoted and dedicated to Francis. She encouraged and aided the man she saw as a spiritual father figure, and took care of him as he grew old. Following Francis' death, Clare continued to promote her order, fighting off every attempt to water down their "radical commitment to corporate poverty." In 1224, an army of rough soldiers from Frederick II came to attack Assisi. Although very sick, Clare went out to meet them with the Blessed Sacrament on her hands. She had the Blessed Sacrament placed at the wall where the enemies could see it. Then on her knees, she begged God to save the Sisters."O Lord, protect these Sisters whom I cannot protect now," she prayed. A voice seemed to answer: "I will keep them always in My care." In that moment, a sudden fright struck the attackers and they fled as fast as they could without harming anyone in Assisi. . Ten years after Clare's death, the order became known as the Order of Saint Clare. She was canonized by Pope Alexander IV September 26, 1255
