SAINT ANDREW Apostle, Patron of Scotland, Russia and of Fishermen

St. Andrew, the brother of St. Peter, was, like his brother, a fisherman by profession. Being a disciple of John the Baptist, he was present at Jesus' Baptism, after which he followed Jesus and also brought him his brother Simon Peter. Andrew is known as the first disciple of Jesus. When Jesus chose his apostles, Andrew was among the Twelve. - It is uncertain where Andrew preached or where he died, but legend tells us he suffered martyrdom at Patras by crucifixion on a cross in the form of an X.

Lord, You raised up St. Andrew, Your Apostle, to preach and rule in Your Church. Grant that we may always experience the benefit of his intercession with You. Amen.

December 1st

SAINT EDMUND CAMPION Patron of Guardian Angels Parish's Secondary School.



St. Edmund Campion was born in London, England

in the year 1540. He grew up in Queen Mary's reign, who restored Catholicism as state religion and was raised a Catholic. Edmund was brilliant, humorous and daring. At the age of 15 he was given a scholarship to St. John's College, Oxford and soon build a great reputation as orator. After Queen Mary's execution, Edmund Campion, to further his academic life, took an oath, acknowledging Queen Elizabeth as head of the Church of England and became an Anglican deacon in 1564. Doubts about England's state religion increasingly troubled him. 1569 he left England for Dublin, Ireland. Further studies convinced him, that he had been in error and he returned to Catholicism. 1571 Edmund returned to England, where, because of her excommunication by Pope Pius V, Queen Elizabeth made it very difficult for professed Catholics. Edmund went to Douai, France There he attended the English College and studied theology and earned a bachelor degree of divinity and was ordained a sub-deacon. He moved to Rome and joined the Society of Jesus, known to us as the "Jesuits". He was assigned to Brno, Bohemia to complete his novitiate and later taught in Prague, where, in 1578 he was ordained. In 1579 he and Father Robert Persons were chosen for the English Mission and were sent to England in 1580. English Catholics were uneasy because they considered Jesuits too zealous and were afraid, that their already bad situation would get worse. Edmund preached in Lancashire where those who heard him remembered his sermons fifty years later. Edmund believed, that he merely had to win arguments intellectually to get a fair hearing The premature publication of his famous Brag, which he had written to present in case he was captured, made him the object of one of the most intensive manhunts. He was betrayed and imprisoned in the Tower of London. The Queen herself gave him an opportunity to renounce his Catholic faith and become a Protestant minister. When he refused the offer, he was charged with treason, not for political reasons, but for religious ones. He then was put in chains, tortured for 11 days, after which he was hanged, drawn and quartered at Tyburn on December 1st, 1581. St. Edmund Campion was canonized by Pope Paul VI in 1970 as one of forty English and Welsh Martyrs.

December 3rd

ST. FRANCIS XAVIER Patron of Foreign Missions



St. Francis Xavier was born 1506 at the castle of Xavier in Navarre, Spain. At the age of 18

he went to Paris to study philosophy where 4 years later he met St. Ignatius Loyola. St. Francis was full of worldly ambitions, but the company of St. Ignatius changed him. He went to Venice and was ordained a priest in 1537. 1541 he set sail for India. The following year he landed in Goa. He extended his apostolic labours to the coast of Malabar, to Travancor, Malacca, the Moluccas and Cylon, today's Sri Lanka. In all these places he converted large numbers to Christianity. 1549 he carried the light of Faith to Japan where he remained for 2 years. 1552 he set sail for China, he arrived at Sancian, where a fever seized him. He died alone on Friday, December 2^{nd} , 1552 at the age of 46.

God our Father, by the preaching of Francis Xavier You brought many nations to Yourself Give his zeal for the faith to all who believe in You, that Your Church may rejoice in continued growth throughout the world. Amen.
