OUR LADY OF GUADALUPE

Patroness of the Americas

On Dec.9, 1531, at Guadalupe, on the outskirts of Mexico City, the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to an Indian convert, Juan Diego, and left with him a

picture of herself impressed upon his cloak. This cloak is preserved in the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe, near Mexico City.

Devotion to Mary under this title has continually increased. In 1737 Our Lady of Guadalupe was pronounced Patroness of Mexico City, in1746 Patroness of all New Spain, in 1910 "Virgin Patroness of Latin America", in 1945 "Queen of Mexico and Empress of the Americas" and with this title she is the Patroness of the Americas. Because of the close link between the Church in Mexico and the United States this feast was placed on the American Calendar. Juan Diego was canonized by Pope John Paul II in 2002. His feast day is celebrated December 9th,

Help the countries of this New World to live with one another in peace, unity, and brotherhood. Set Your justice in our hearts that Your peace will reign in all the world. Amen.

SAINT LUCY

Patroness of the Blind

Born about 283 St. Lucy, a native of Sicily, Italy, was from her cradle educated in the Christian Faith by her widowed mother. At an early age St. Lucy secretly made a vow of virginity, which she only disclosed to her mother after her mother was cured of a disease at the tomb of St. Agatha. In gratitude for her healing, St. Lucy's mother left her free to follow her pious inclinations, but a young nobleman who had sought Lucy in marriage was so enraged that he told the authorities of Lucy of being a Christian and she was imprisoned about the year 303. By the grace of God she overcame all tortures she was made to endure. About the year 304 she met her death by the sword. The name Lucy derived from lux – light. Because of this people with eye trouble invoke her help.

Lord, may the intercession of Your Virgin and Martyr St. Lucy help us so that, as we celebrate her heavenly birthday on earth, we may contemplate her triumph in heaven. Amen.

December 14th

ST. JOHN OF THE CROSS

John was born in Fontiveros, a small town northwest of Madrid, Spain. His father was born into a prosperous

family, but was disowned for marrying Caterina, a poor women (John's mother) and had to turn from being a silk merchant to weaving silk with his own hands. He died when John was about one year old, leaving his wife to raise three children in dire poverty. John was sent to an orphanage, where he learned to read and write. When fifteen years old, he was sent to a hospital where he had to perform the most menial and unpleasant tasks. The administrator recognized his natural intelligence and sent him to the Jesuit College in Medina del Campo, telling him he could return as

hospital chaplain if he became a priest. He studied there for four years, but felt God was calling him to monastic life. He entered the Carmelite priory and became a Friar. The Carmelites sent him to the University of Salamanca to study theology. In 1567 he was ordained a priest. He met Teresa of Avila, who had just started to reform Carmelite convents and John followed her. He became Teresa of Avila's confessor and though she may have teased him about his youth, high seriousness and small stature, he exerted priestly authority over her. The unreformed Carmelites did not take kindly to what Teresa and John were doing. Teresa had the King's protection, but John did not. An inquisitor general was sent from Italy and John was arrested and imprisoned, but was released on orders of the papal nuncio, but was rearrested after the nuncio died. John endured humiliation and ill treatment; he had no heat or light in his cell. And still he was able to compose beautiful works, which earned him the title of being "The greatest poet of the love of God" In August 1578 John was able to escape and was able to make his way to convent of reformed Carmelite nuns. The next morning a canon of the Cathedral, a member of a powerful noble family, took John under his protection. The death of Teresa in 1582 left him exposed to opposition. In 1591 he was stripped of all his offices and was sent a simple friar to a remote convent. He died shortly thereafter on December 14, 1591, was beatified in 1675 and canonized in 1726. He was declared a Doctor of the Church in 1926.


